

We use the *possessive forms* to show that something *belongs to someone*.

This is  
Blue-Blue's ball.  
It belongs to Blue-Blue.



These are  
Blue-Blue's socks.  
They belong to Blue-Blue.



## ASKING ABOUT POSSESSION

When we want to know who one or more things belong to, we use *Whose is* or *Whose are*.

Whose smartphone  
is this?  
It belongs to Blue-Blue.



Whose keys  
are these?  
They belong to Blue-Blue.



We use *'s* after someone's name to show that something belongs to him or her.
