We use the possesive forms to show that something belongs to someone.

This is Blue-Blue's ball. It belongs to Blue-Blue.



These are Blue-Blue's socks. They belong to Blue-Blue.



ASKING ABOUT POSSESSION

When we want to know who one or more things belong to, we use Whose is or Whose are.

Whose smartphone is this? It belongs to Blue-Blue.



Whose keys are these? They belong to Blue-Blue.



We use 's after someone's name to show that something belongs to him or her.
