

Personal Pronouns






There are different kinds of pronouns. Personal pronouns are the most known of all because we use them so often in sentences and questions.

PLURAL



more than one person, animal or thing



Subject pronouns take the place of nouns that are the subject of the sentence.

See examples below.

Daisy is my friend. She is my friend.

Bees make honey. They make honey.

You have a box.	(900) The box belongs to you.
they They have socks.	(them) The socks belong to them.




Object pronouns take the place of nouns. They are used as the object of the Verb in a sentence.



The object of a sentence is the person, place, animal or thing that receives the action shown by the verb.
